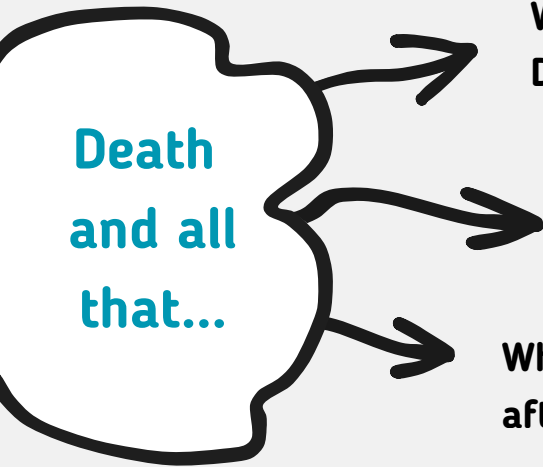

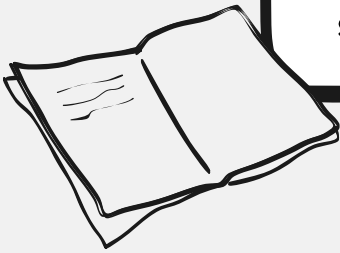
? What does this mean in terms of going to Heaven or Hell immediately after dying?

But also, a few things don't seem to add up here...

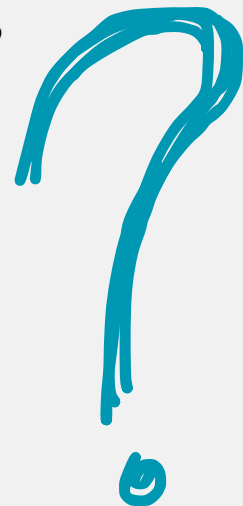

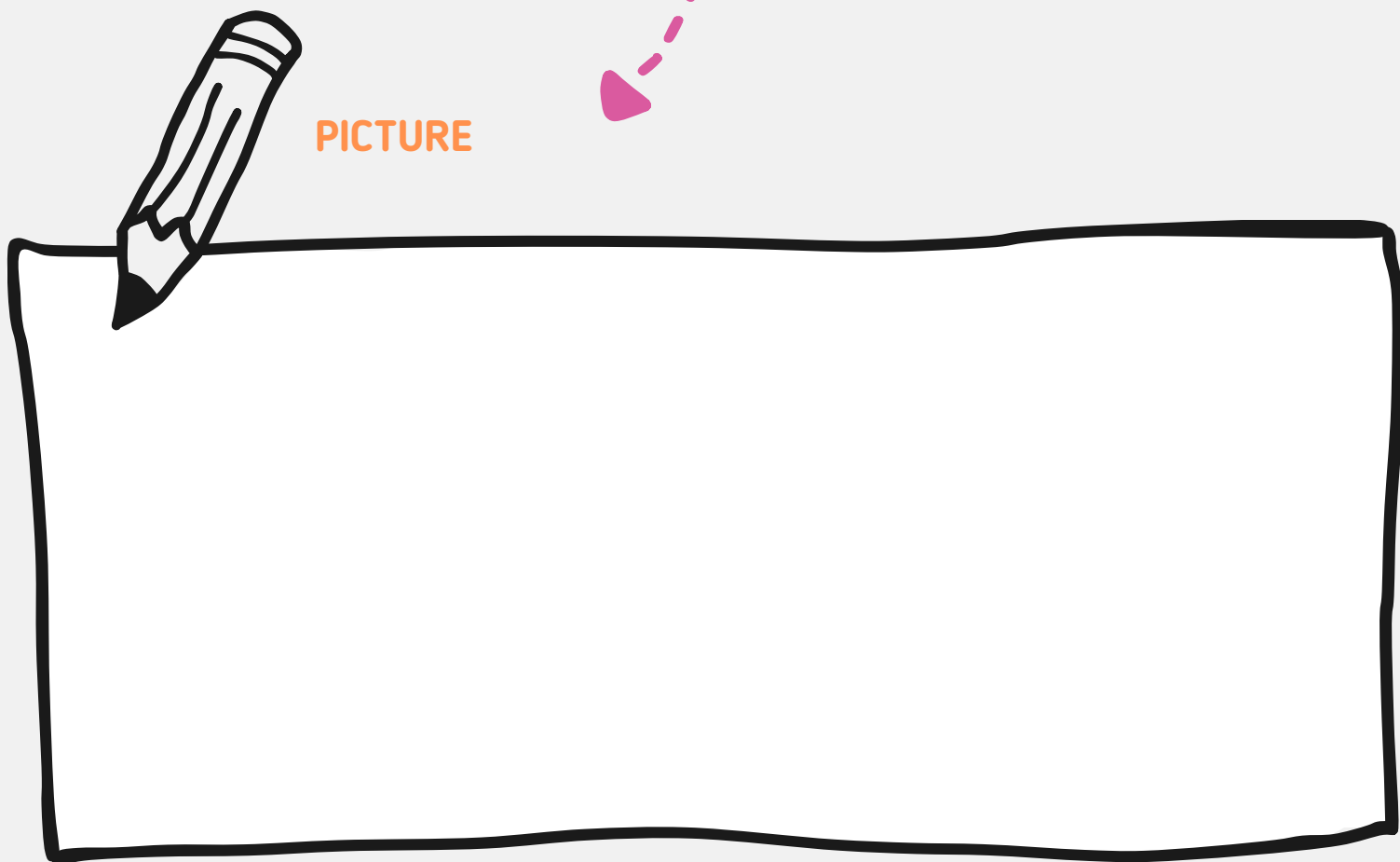
? If eternal life is the opposite of eternal death, what does that mean for a peaceful, sin-free future in Heaven?

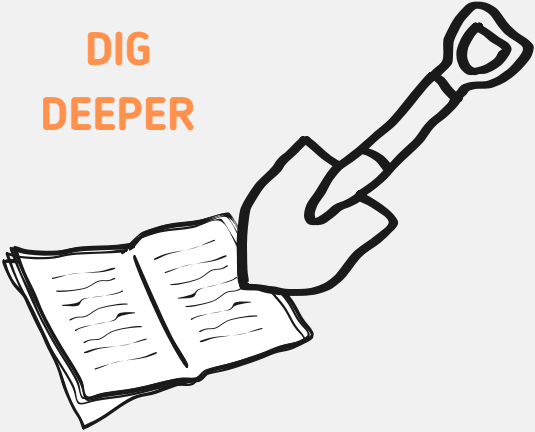
