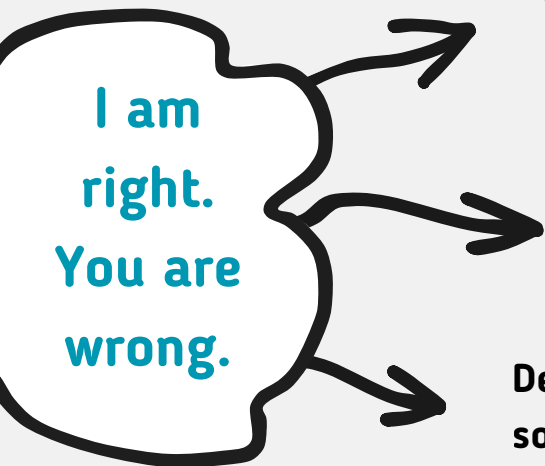


RE:SOLUTION

He does, however, start many sentences with “I am...”

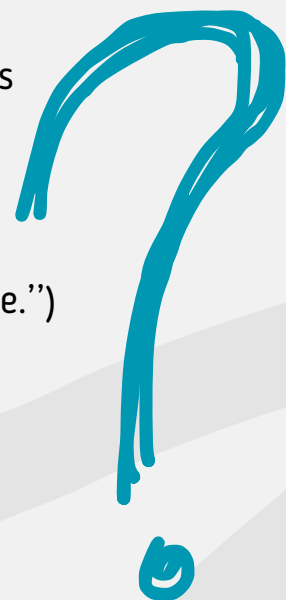

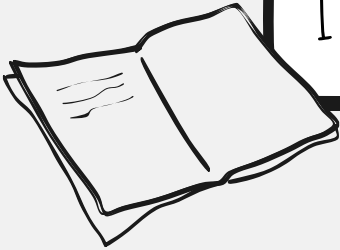

It is one of my least proud moments in life, but I am going to share it with you as we are on this honest journey together. My younger sister and I were disputing, and I lost control and slapped her across the face. This is a massive breach of all boundaries - mine and hers. It stopped our fight instantly as we were both so shocked at what I had done, and I apologised immediately. I am proud to say I have never come close to slapping anyone since that day.



I wouldn't **re:commend** this method of conflict **re:solution**!

5 C's

These are 5 steps for good conflict **re:solution**.

1. Calmness	Have you ever heard your mum count to 10 before she answers you? <i>Hint: she is re:gaining calmness!</i>
2. Clear communication	Expressing concerns so that the issue is not just ignored. Don't just say "it doesn't matter".
3. Clarification	Trying to understand all perspectives. EG. "When you say ... does this mean ...?"
4. Collaboration	Finding common ground and understanding each other.
5. Compromise	Meeting in the middle and reaching a solution which both are satisfied with. <i>A clash of 2 ideas can produce a 3rd!</i>

IMPORTANT!

Conflict **re:solution** does not always end with you getting everything the way you want it to be. In fact, rarely will it all land exactly how you desire it to be. However, **we** can play a huge role in the smoothness of **re:solving** the issue.

I SENTENCES

In the **heat** of the moment, it can be hard to keep our **cool**. We want the other person to know how wrong they are! However, it is SO important to think of our language when in a dispute. Our words can add **fire** or **water** to the situation.

'I sentences' help to clarify your own thoughts and feelings whilst telling the 'what' and 'why' around the situation, without blaming the other person and creating further conflict.

I feel... when... because...

Here is an example of how one might say something in the heat of the moment, trying to express themselves, followed by the same example presented as an 'I sentence'.

*"You never listen to me! You are always on your phone when I talk!
I might as well not even try."*

*"I **feel** ignored and unimportant **when** you start playing on your phone when I am talking **because** it looks like you aren't even interested in listening to me at all."*

1. You can make a New Years **re:solution** a.k.a. something you want to aim for or change in the next year.
2. The quality of a good screen / picture is having a high **re:solution**.
3. To come to an agreement or solve a problem is reaching a **re:solution**.
4. To have a strong **re:solution** means that you are determined in your purpose.
5. A story's **re:solution** is the ending of its plot.
6. If you allow me to play with the word a little by breaking it up... a **RE solution** is kind of what we talked about earlier by coming to a mutual compromise in a conflict.

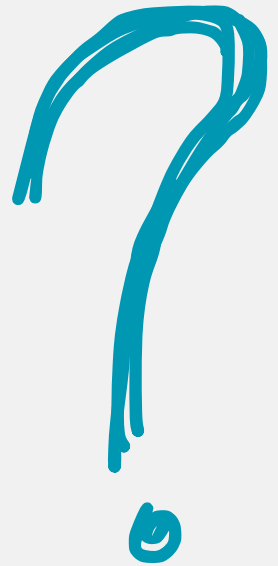
? Have you ever tried giving a surprisingly calm answer in **re:sponse** or **re:paying** meanness with niceness? Tell about that experience.

? These last 2 verses use the words, 'on the contrary'. Why do think this is significant?

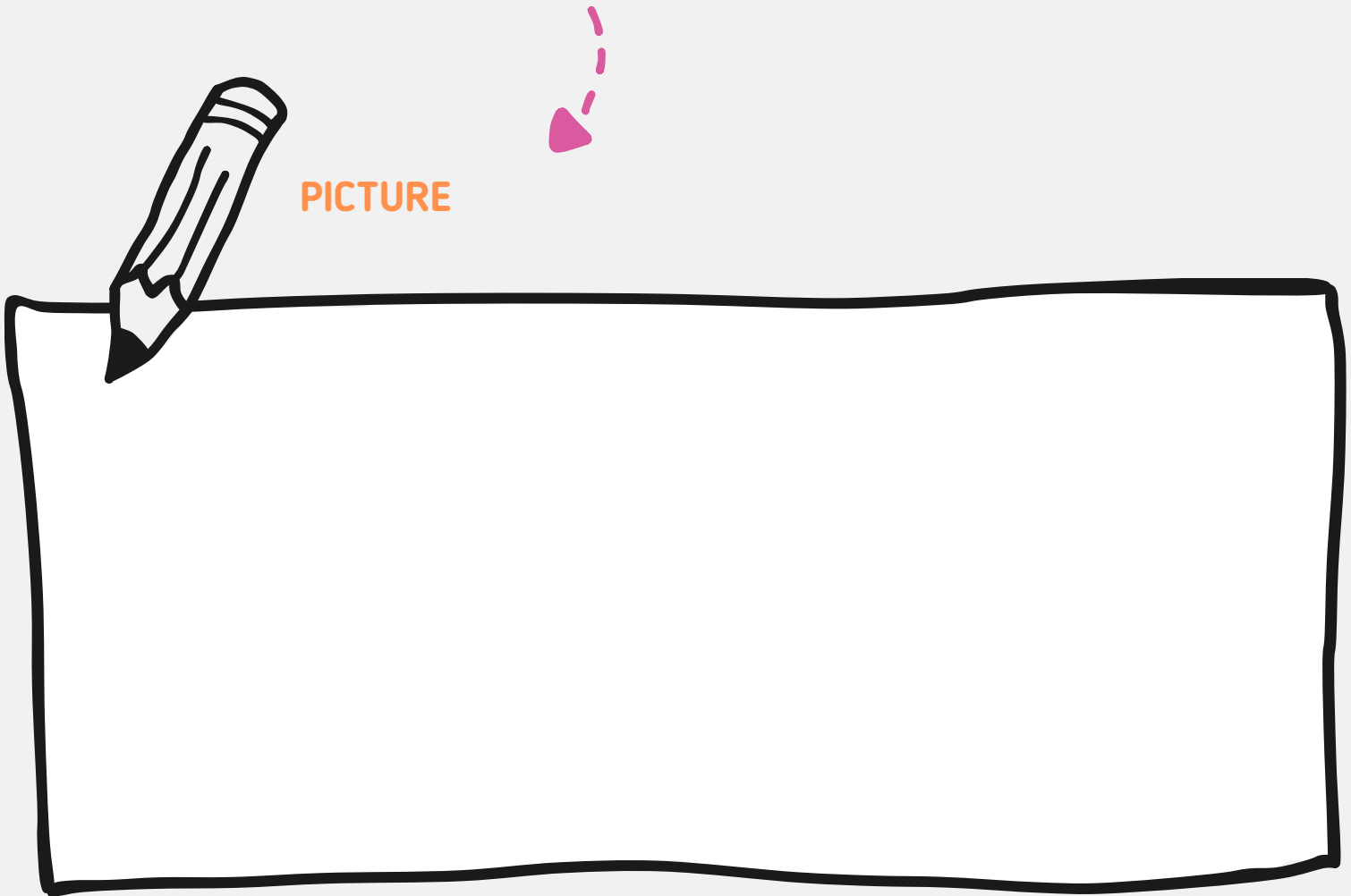
? We just read that to **re:pay** your enemy will “heap burning coals on his head”. What does this actually mean and how does that fit with loving our neighbour as ourselves?

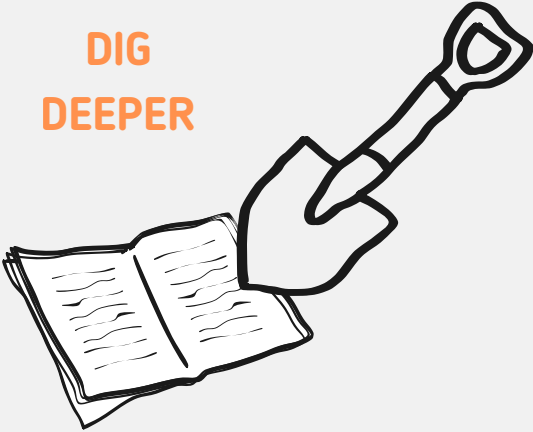
